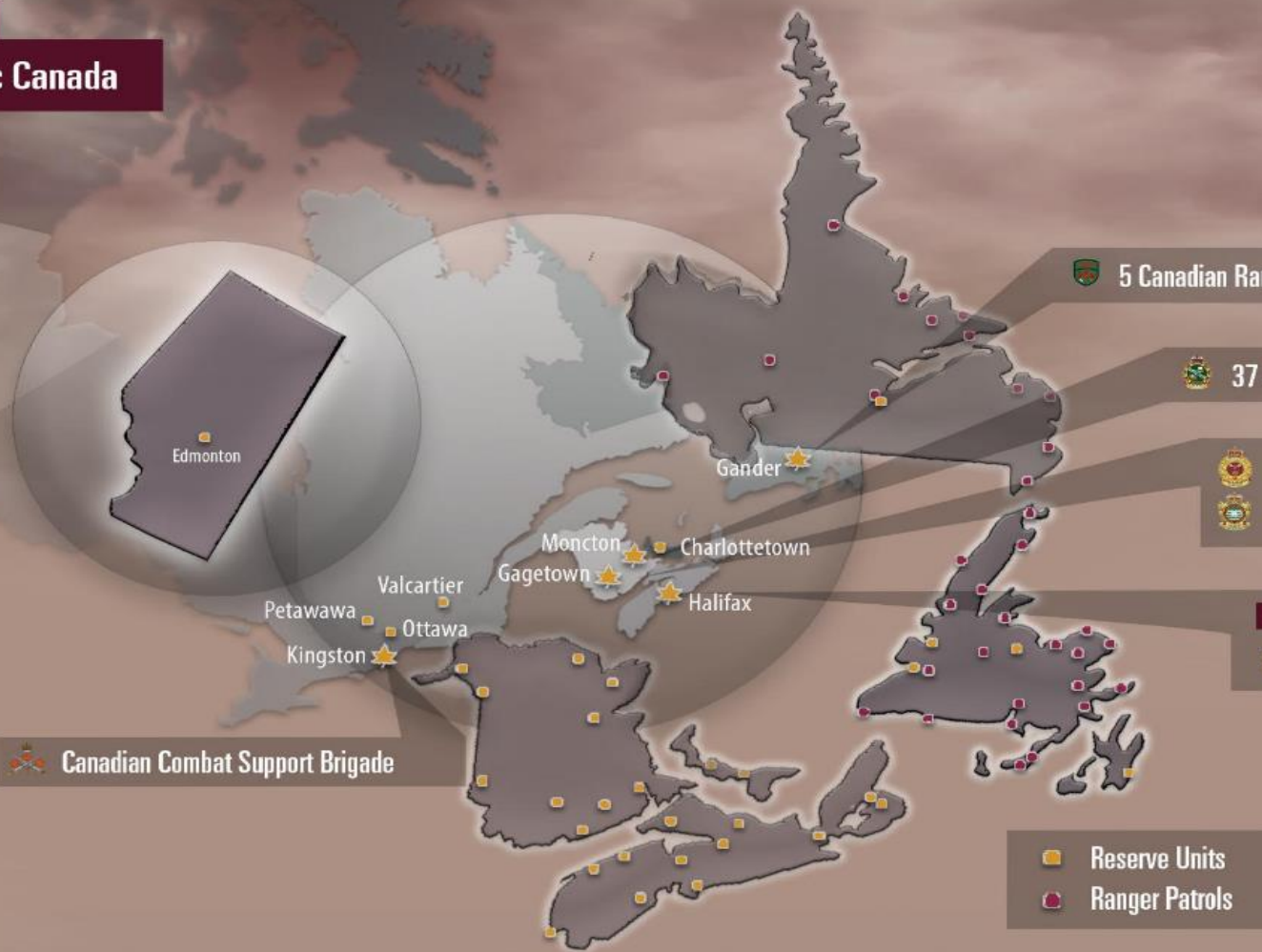

The 5th Canadian Division is a formation of the Canadian Army responsible for the command and control of army units in the provinces of New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island and Newfoundland and Labrador. The Division also has units located in Ontario, Quebec, and Alberta.



CCSB



The Canadian Combat Support Brigade (CCSB) is the Canadian Army's center of excellence for intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance, electronic warfare and information operations.

36 CBG



36 Canadian Brigade Group is a Reserve Force brigade of the Canadian Army, which Commands Reserve Force units of the 5th Canadian Division in Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island.

37 CBG



37 Canadian Brigade Group is a Reserve Force brigade of the Canadian Army, which Commands Reserve Force units of the 5th Canadian Division in New Brunswick and Newfoundland and Labrador.

5 CDSG



5th Canadian Division Support Group Gagetown provides personnel, operational, logistical, financial, safety and environmental services and support to all units of the Division.

5 CDTC



5th Canadian Division Training Centre provides individual training to Regular Force and Reserve Force officers and soldiers. They are also home to Black Bear, the Division's annual Indigenous Youth Summer Training program.

5 CRPG



5th Canadian Ranger Patrol Group is responsible for the area of Newfoundland and Labrador. The Rangers, known as the Watchers provide patrols for national security, public safety missions, and aiding in emergency situations in sparsely populated northern, coastal and isolated areas of Newfoundland and Labrador.

Role of the Army Reserve

- A professional part-time force for local employment with a responsive capability, at home or abroad, in support of Canada
- Participation in domestic operations:
 - Hurricane relief efforts in Newfoundland and Labrador 2010
 - Ice Storm in New Brunswick 2017
 - Flood relief efforts in New Brunswick 2018, 2019
 - Hurricane relief efforts in Nova Scotia 2019
 - Snow storm relief efforts in Newfoundland 2020
- Participation in international operations (since 2000):
 - 4,642 Army Reservists deployed to Afghanistan
 - 150 Army Reservists deployed on 16 other missions

Full-Time Summer Employment

- Full Time Summer Employment (1 May – 31 Aug) involves military occupational training over four years totalling approximately \$68K in salary plus room and board and medical and dental coverage during the training years
- \$2K annual bursary for those in a post-secondary program (\$8K over four years)
- Part-time employment during the fall/winter/spring; one night per week, one weekend per month plus other tasks as the member is available. For an entry level private, that would mean approximately \$4K per year.

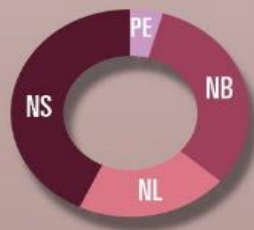

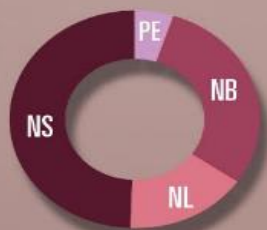
