HAVE YOU HEARD OF RECORD OF SERVICE CARD (NDI 75)?

For those of you who have served in either the Regular Reserve Force. or on either of these leaving organizations you should have been given a Record of Service Card (NDI 75) which shows your years of service and retirement rank. If you don't have one, you are entitled to request one at a cost to you of \$15, payable to the Receiver General of Canada. All you have to do is fill in a form DND 2381. enclose а money order and provide two colour photographs of yourself, 1 1/2 X 2 inches in size.

There are many advantages of having such a card such as entry into military establishments here in Canada and the United States: use of military facilities, and reduced rates when travelling for accommodation. Showing your card will even get you military rates at Walt Disney World! I'm sure there are many other uses but these quickly come to mind. Talk to our travelling President, Tom Birchall and he will tell vou the many uses he has made of his.

IN MEMORIAM

In December, we lost two long time members of the Institute.

On December 4th, **Dr. Glen** Hancock passed away in Valley Regional the Hospital. During WW II, he joined the RCAF and served overseas for both the RAF and the RCAF from 1940-1945 discharging with the rank of Squadron Leader. He flew Lancasters with 408 Squadron on one of his tours. His lengthy achievements were outlined in the Chronicle-Herald. A memorial service to celebrate his life was held in Wolfville Baptist Church on Tuesday, January 17th.

On December 11th, **Donald McCrea Duncan** passed away in his 90th year. He served in the Canadian Army in WW II. After the war, he was employed with the Nova Scotia Council Boy Scouts of Canada as Provincial Executive Director retiring after 38 years of service.

THE NEW BRUNSWICK MILITARY HISTORY MUSEUM COME TO LIFE

I recently received information from the Director of the New Brunswick Military History Museum now located in the newly renovated Royal Canadian Dragoons mess at CFB Gagetown. A long overdue project is now coming to fruition. Here is the information the Director, Capt Kevin Anderson gave me in a meeting we held here in Dartmouth.

"We are in the process of renovating our Museum. I am actually trying to create a 'centre of excellence' for the study of military history in NB. To that end, we have received over \$2 million in funding from the Directorate of History and Heritage at NDHQ and we have partnered with the Gregg Centre at UNB to capture the battles that occurred in NB since the 1600s and to tell the stories of New Brunswickers at war and peace. One of our signature exhibits will feature the Voodoo on standby in Chatham. We will also cover other significant Air Force related stories including the BCATP, Tracadie Air

Range, St. Margaret's and the Golden Hawks. The actual mission of the New Brunswick Military History Museum is to collect, preserve, research and exhibit artifacts which illustrate the history and heritage of the military forces in New Brunswick, and New Brunswickers at war, during peacetime, and on United Nations or North Atlantic Treaty Organization duty.

We have a couple of areas you may be interested in. The first, is the Commanders Club. The "Commanders Club" was established in August 2011 as a Patron organization for the New Brunswick Military History Museum. Membership in the "Commanders Club" is open to all current and former Commanders of the Canadian Army, Royal Canadian Air Force, Royal Canadian Navy or Canadian Forces Bases, Stations or Units (including the Combat Training Centre) that are, or were. located in the Province of New Brunswick; current or former Commanding Officers of Her Majesty's Canadian Ships named after New Brunswick locations; and to any resident of New Brunswick that served as a Commanding Officer of a Base/Station or Unit.

whether in Canada or elsewhere. Membership is also open to select New Brunswick individuals in business, academics, politics or the arts by invitation of the Commander. To become a member of the "Commanders Club", a donation must be made to the New Brunswick Military History Museum. The donation, whether cash or gift-in-kind, is up to the discretion of the individual. Membership can be obtained posthumously through a donation from the family in the individual's name.

The second area is the "Friends of the New Brunswick Military History Museum". They are a historically-minded support group. Their aim is to support the preservation and recording of all military history with a connection to the province of New Brunswick. Members of the "Friends" support the Museum in various ways from volunteering to help with restoration of vehicles or providing guide services, to conducting historical research, fund raising or promoting the Museum. New members are always welcome. The "Friends" are presently undergoing incorporation and

registration as a not-forprofit charity".
